

Student Packing List

Seattle and San Juan Islands Educational Class Trip

We'll be traveling for seven days and six night. We will not have access to laundry facilities, the weather will most likely be cool and rainy, we will be showering in school gym facilities, and we will be sleeping on gym or classroom floors. Please plan accordingly. Participants will be able to bring one checked suitcase up to 50 lbs. (50.1 lbs. incurs a stiff penalty, so verify that you are under the weight limit!), one carryon, and one personal item (See Alaska's luggage guidelines). The key for comfort in the PNW is **layers**. Be prepared to go from cold, rainy, windy weather outside into warm and dry indoors. During the weather will probably be in the upper 50's/low 60's and with high probability of rain.

Student Conduct and Dress Code

Conduct should support Linda Vista's values at all times, and school handbook policies still apply.

Cell phones will be allowed for entertainment on the airplane only, for taking pictures throughout the trip, and for phone calls to parents with the permission of chaperones.

You will be representing Linda Vista Adventist Elementary School throughout the entire trip, and as such, you are required to conform to our handbook's free dress policies, including:

- No jewelry, bracelets, earrings, necklaces, etc.
- All shirts must have sleeves.
- No skinny jeans or leggings.
- Shorts and dresses should be near the knee.
- No open-toed shoes.
- Graphics, logos, and text should support LVAES' values
- One exception is that students will be allowed to wear hats, except when traveling on public transportation.

What to Bring

- Sleeping bag
- Sleeping pad (Sleeping on gym or classroom floors for six nights!)
- Pillow
- Shirts for seven days
- Pants for seven days.
- Underwear for seven days
- Socks for seven days, plus several extra in case your feet get wet hiking, tide pooling, or kayaking.
- Warm and comfortable shoes
- Thick sweatshirt or fleece
- Weatherproof jacket or shell
- Hat (Optional)

- Toiletries (You know what you need for yourself, but some examples are toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.)
- Swimsuit for showering in case of open stalls.
- Sandals for showering.
- Towel
- Sunscreen (You can still get sunburned on an overcast day)
- Water bottle
- Bible
- Bible Journal (Same as the one you use for class is fine)
- Camera (Cell phone camera is fine, unless you lose your privilege...)
- Things to do together, such as card games
